Bournemouth overwhelm a struggling Bridgwater side

Result: Bournemouth 107/17t11c v 0 Bridgwater & Albion. **HT:** 45/7t5c v 0.

Weather: Bright at first with a freshish Easterly breeze that blew straight up the pitch and which brought in cloud cover as the game progressed.

Ground: The ground was firm under foot despite very heavy overnight rain with a good covering of grass.

Kick-off: Bournemouth (Scott Chislett) kicked off from right to left as viewed from the stand and to his left.

On this Remembrance weekend, two minutes silence was held before the game as a mark of respect to those who have given their lives in the service of their country.

The score says it all. Bournemouth were far too strong and skilful for a young Bridgwater side that was simply blown away. Some of the passing and passages of play were at times sublime and Bridgwater were left grasping at shadows. Nonetheless they kept tackling and tried to take the game to Bournemouth but found their hosts in an unforgiving mood and who never gave the visitors a sniff of a score. Might have taken a crack at goal on a couple of occasions but that was about it.

For Bournemouth it was a day of records. Robbie Searle in only his first season with two tries and eleven conversions created a new match points record of 32, overtaking Mike Pope's 31 points set in October 2008. He was one short of Jon Sanchez's goal-kicking record of 12 set in February 2005. James Flynn set a new career hat-trick record of six overtaking Guy Spencer's record set in February 2005. James also equalled his own record of three hat-tricks in a season. Bournemouth have eight of the top seventeen try-scorers in the division, with James Flynn on 13 and Robbie Searle on 11 first and second respectively. Robbie is also the second highest points scorer with 118.

League Positions: Bournemouth remain first on 49 points. Bridgwater & Albion remain fourteenth on 2 points.

In the League: James Flynn equals his own record of three hat-tricks in a season, sets a new career record of six hat-tricks and passes 350 (362) points in a career; Sam Hardcastle extended his own career try-scoring record to 109; Alan Manning extended his own record of consecutive appearances as tighthead prop, as a forward and as captain to 48; Robbie Searle sets a new points-scoring record in a match of 32 and passes 100 (118) points in a season; Frazer Wilford plays for the 50th time.
